DISMISSAL DURING THE SCHOOL DAY

Once students have reported to school, they are expected to remain in school and attend classes all day. Under the following conditions, a student may be dismissed early:

- 1. <u>For students who are 18+:</u> A written request from a parent/guardian (or an emergency contact) must be presented or a phone call must be received by the Attendance Office.
- 2. For students who are under 18 and drive to school: A written request from a parent/guardian must be presented or a phone call must be received by the Attendance Office.
- 3. <u>Students who are emancipated:</u> Students who are legally emancipated may sign themselves out without parent/guardian contact.
- 4. All other students: A parent/guardian (or an emergency contact) must come to the attendance office and personally request dismissal.
- All students must sign out in the Attendance Office. If the student returns to school, the student
 must sign back in at the Attendance Office to verify the time of his/her return and provide the
 appropriate excuse. Failure to turn in an excuse will cause any absence to be considered
 unexcused.

COMMUNICATIONS FROM PARENTS/GUARDIANS

- It is the responsibility of parents/guardians to communicate to the school the reason for all absences.
- Parent/Guardian notes to request an early dismissal must be presented to the attendance office before the student is dismissed.

CONTENT OF PARENT/GUARDIAN NOTES

All parent notes for any reason must include the following:

- 1. the student's name and grade
- 2. the date of the dismissal or absence(s)
- 3. the specific reason for the absence, lateness or dismissal
- 4. the signature of the parent/guardian
- 5. a daytime phone number where a parent can be reached to verify the note

"Blanket" notes covering unspecified dates of absences, tardies, etc. are not acceptable. (for example: "Please excuse my child from all absences in the months of April and May due to illness.")
